May 22nd, 2020 - many people still associate palliative care with care in the terminal stage of cancer and patients with cancer remain more likely to receive it than those with other illnesses 1 it is often delayed until the last weeks or days of life once the illness is advanced and disease focused treatments are no longer effective however late palliative care is a missed opportunity to do better for'
